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

The emphasis on volume and the shoulders is a reference to the 1980s when the original Alien movie series was released.

This knitwear collection was inspired by the flow of blood inside the human body and water inside plants and thus the design details focus on tissue, roots, leaves, bones, muscles and cells. The silhouette of the collection is derived from a rectangle that has been twisted to represent the flow of liquid inside living things. The silhouette is complimented by ruffles, which symbolise the muscles and ribs of human beings or the sharp edges of leaves. Metal trimmings have been used to finish pieces in the collection.



The rainforests are the lungs of the earth, absorbing pollutants and processing vast quantities of oxygen. Deforestation and the burning of trees release huge quantities of carbon dioxide that have been stored within forests over many decades. The pattern in this textile design represents the process of deforestation and it has been crafted to suggest the barren environment that is left once trees have been removed. The scorched earth of a burnt forest is represented by the colour purple and the motifs in the fabric are designed to suggest the angry eyes of a mourning world.





